

I-CAN CoS Project | Frequently Asked Questions

What qualifications and experience are required to apply?

You must be either

- (a) An allied health professional, or
- (b) An existing certified I-CAN Assessor

What information or documents do I need to provide?

- Your CV
- Certified copy of passport or drivers' licence
- Details of two referees
- Your ABN and Registration Name
- A National Criminal Record Check, no older than 6 months
- If you are an allied health professional, evidence of current registration/membership/eligibility for membership of the relevant professional body

Will I receive training to become a certified I-CAN Assessor?

If you have not yet been certified as an I-CAN Assessor, you will be required to attend a full day training session on use of the tool, as well as a follow up half day session on the I-CAN Version CoS.

If you are already a certified I-CAN Assessor, and completed your training within the last 3 years, you will only be required to attend a half day training session on the I-CAN Version CoS.

Training will be conducted online – there is no requirement to attend in-person.

Training includes a certification requirement, which will involve conducting and submitting an I-CAN assessment for review and feedback.

You will be paid an hourly rate to attend training and complete the certification process.

Do I need my own computer and internet connection?

Yes, you will need a computer and internet to be able to complete both the training and certification process, and the assessments you subsequently conduct.

How will I be engaged?

You will be engaged as a contractor for the duration of the pilot project. The contract may be extended after this date.

What is the contractor hourly rate?

Contractors will receive an hourly rate of \$90. GST and superannuation will also be paid to you by CDS if you are eligible.

You will be required to submit a monthly invoice, and payment will be made in accordance with the terms of your contract.

Do I need my own insurance?

When undertaking contracted work on this project you will be covered by the CDS professional indemnity and public liability insurance policies.

You may also wish to check the coverage provided by your own insurer.

What workload can I expect?

Your workload will be negotiated in discussion with you, however you must commit to undertaking 10 client assessments between the time of your certification as an I-CAN Version CoS assessor, and 31 May 2021.

We anticipate that each assessment will take between 6 and 10 hours.

How will the assessments be conducted?

All assessments will be done over the phone or via video conference.

The I-CAN Version CoS Project Team will compile referrals, consent documents and basic client information which will be provided to you prior to the commencement of each assessment, including a budgeted number of assessment hours based on anticipated complexity.

What support will I receive?

CDS will provide technical support related to the functioning of the I-CAN Version CoS Assessment Tool.

A professional peer support network will also be established and facilitated by the I-CAN Version CoS Project Team. Attendance will be voluntary, but hours can be counted towards your continuing professional development program. Peer support network will be facilitated by an experienced Occupational Therapist or Speech Pathologist from the CDS I-CAN team.

Can I use the I-CAN Version CoS tool when I am assessing private clients?

You cannot use the I-CAN Version CoS tool to assess private clients. It can only be used for referrals that are part of this project.

If you would like to use the I-CAN version 6 tool in your own practice you are able to take out your own license to use I-CAN Version 6. You will not need to complete any additional training to use this version, however, will incur a license fee.
