The Australian government gave \$22 million for the Centre to run.



The money is for 3 years.

The groups in the Consortium know lots about health for people with intellectual disability.

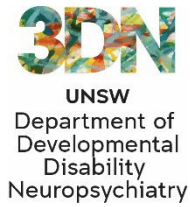


They know how to make sure people with intellectual disability are part of things.
