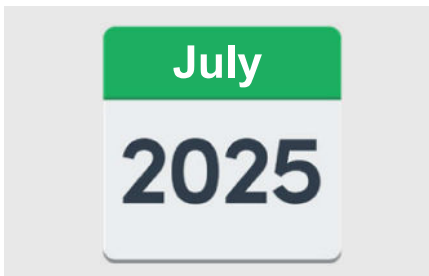


About the conference

We are having a **conference** in July 2025.



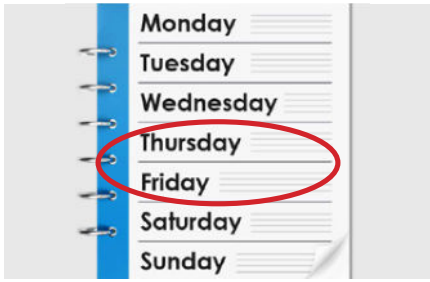
A **conference** is when lots of people come together to talk about an issue.



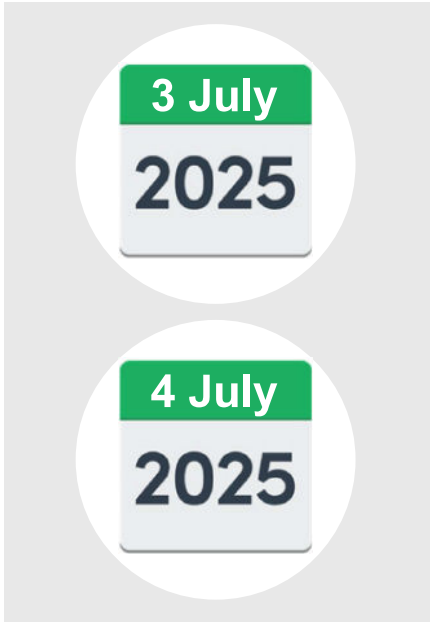
Our conference is about the health of people with intellectual disability.

- Friday 4 July 2025.

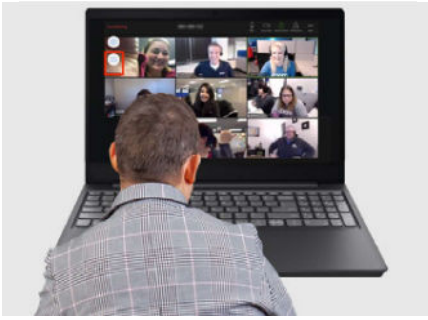


You can come to the conference in person at the **Sydney Masonic Centre**.

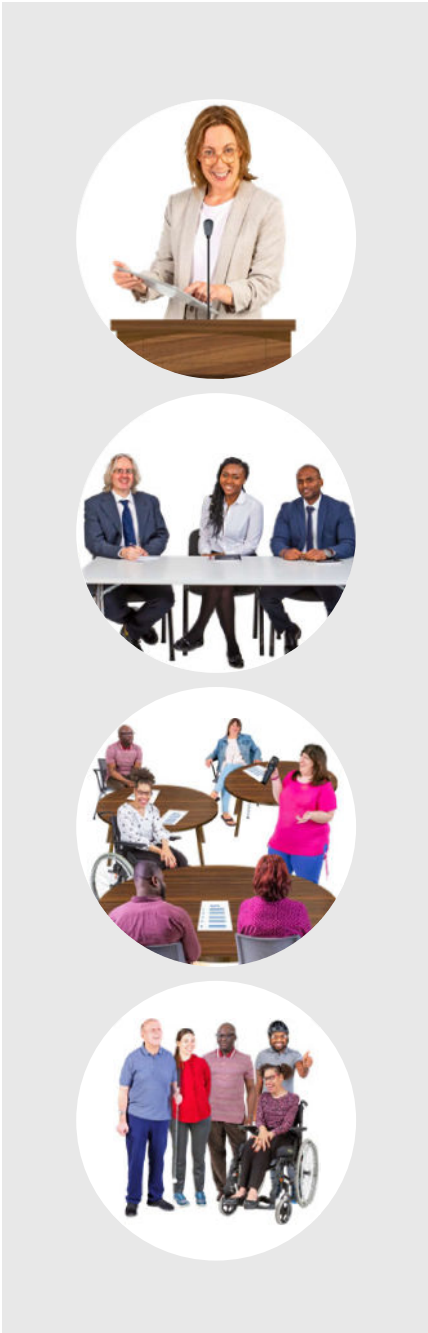

Advocates are people who speak up for the rights of people with intellectual disability.

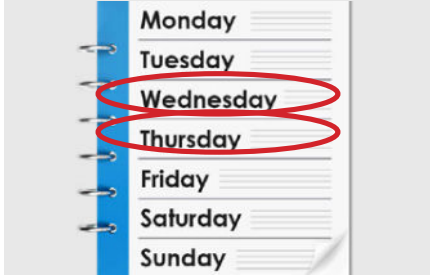


Everyone will be able to work together at the conference.

You can buy tickets for the conference to come to 1 day or both days.

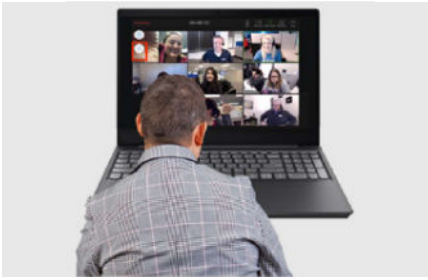


You can buy tickets to come in person or online.

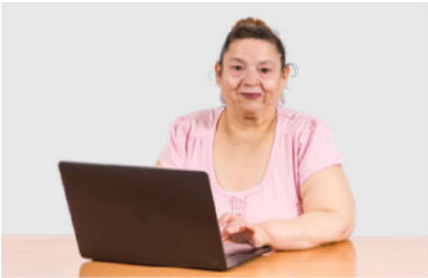


If you buy a ticket to come in person it pays for you to

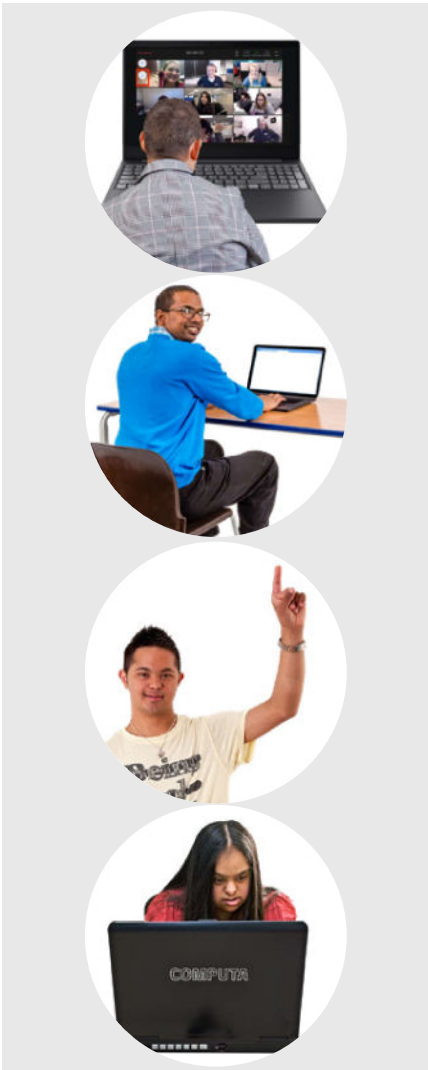
- Get into the conference

- Go to some of the sessions online
- Ask questions in sessions
- Keep a copy of the sessions that are live streamed.

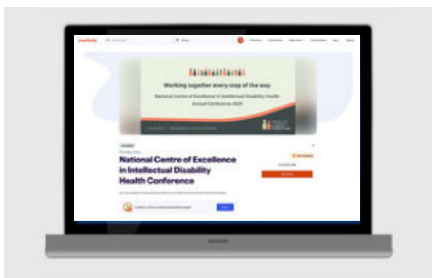
Register for the conference



You will need to **register** for the conference if you want to come.

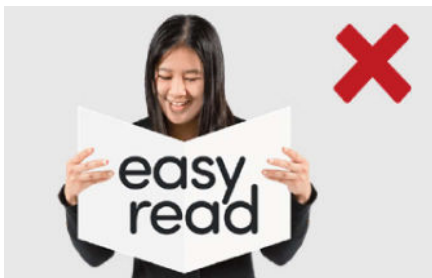


Register means you sign up to come to the conference.

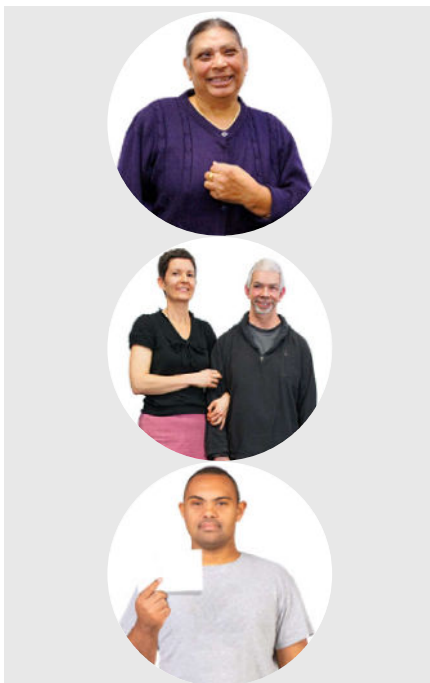
Types of tickets



There are different types of tickets you can get for the conference.



Full price tickets are for anyone who wants to come to the conference.



Concession tickets are tickets are for people who

- Have an intellectual disability

or

- Support a person with intellectual disability at the conference

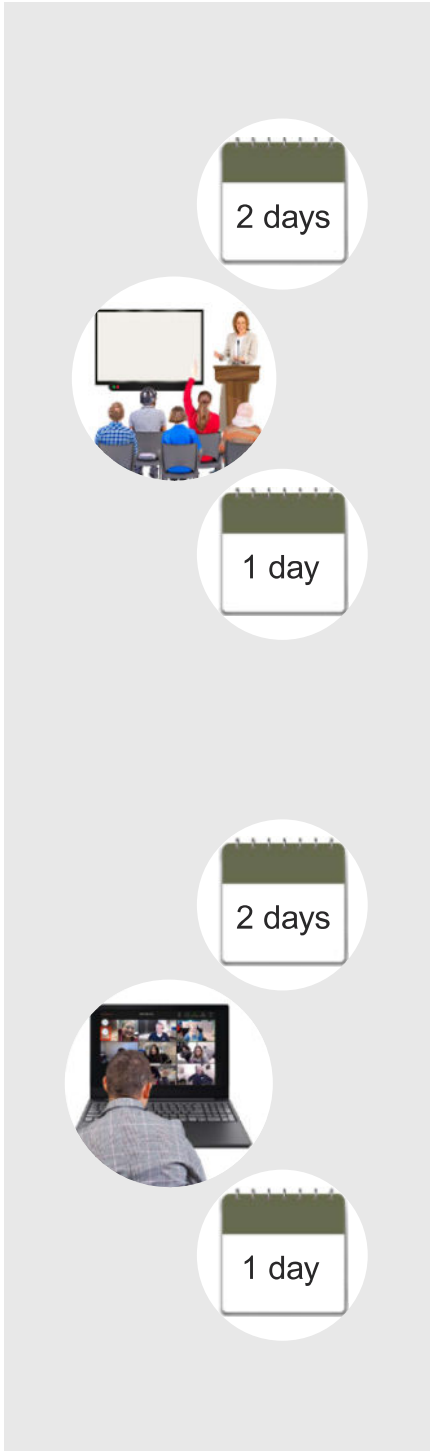
or

- Have a government card like a concession or pension card.



Partner and Collaborator tickets are for people from organisations the Centre works with.

Ticket prices



The full price for the tickets are

- \$650 to come in person 2 days
- \$450 to come in person 1 day
- \$40 to come online 2 days
- \$25 to come online 1 day.

The price of concession tickets are




2 days

- \$200 to come in person 2 days



1 day

- \$150 to come in person 1 day



2 days

- \$25 to come online 2 days

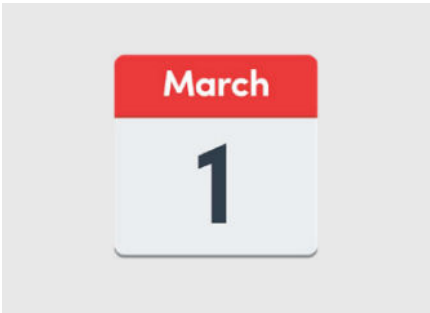


1 day

- \$15 to come online 1 day.

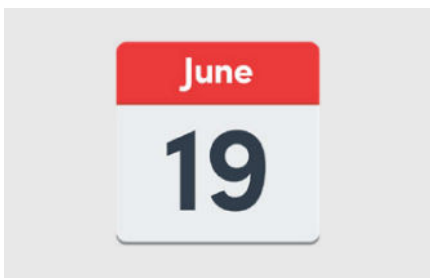
Refunds

Conference scholarship



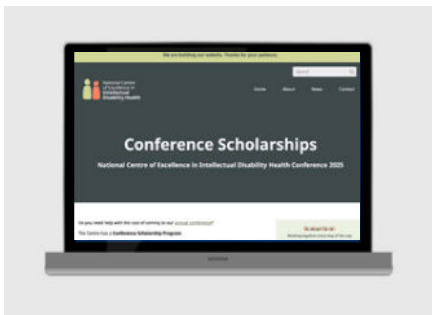
You can ask for a **conference scholarship** if you do not have enough money for the conference.
