We do lots of projects and research




We are located at the University of Sydney

You will think about which what health topics are important to you



You will make artworks about what health topics are important to you



You must read the Participation
Information Statement to be able to
participate in the art competition



You must also sign a consent form to be able to participate in the art competition



You can enter the online art competition if you...



Are 18+ years old



Identify as having an intellectual disability



Live in Australia



Are an amateur artist



An **amateur artist** means you do not make money from your art



The art competition is free to enter



Your artwork must be original and made by you



It must not be made by someone else



You can use any type of art you like for the competition

This could be...



Painting or drawing



Sculpture



Music or dance



Digital Art



Other kinds of art



We will help you if you need materials



Your artwork should show what you think is important in health research



You can send us your artwork from 14 November 2025 until 16 January 2026



This means you have about two months to create your artwork



You can enter the competition by uploading a digital copy of your artwork to our website

You must send an **artist statement** with your artwork



An **artist statement** is a description of your artwork



This means you can tell us what your artwork is about.

You can also tell us also why you created your artwork

A **judging panel** will decide the winners



A **judging panel** is a group of people who know a lot about art and can decide on who should win a prize



There will be 4 prize categories



\$1000 gift voucher for art supplies or art classes for 1st prize



\$500 gift voucher for art supplies or art classes for 2nd prize



\$500 gift voucher for art supplies or art classes for 3rd prize



\$500 gift voucher for art supplies or art classes for people's choice award



Prizes will be awarded at an event in February 2026



You are invited to attend the prize ceremony



You can invite your family and friends to attend the event



We will fly winners and one support worker to Sydney so they can attend our Sydney event



We will organise accommodation for winners and one support worker so they can attend our event



You will always own the **Copyright** of you artwork



Copyright means that the artwork belongs to you and will not be owned by the researchers



A digital copy of your artwork will be displayed in an online exhibition



Your artwork will be **attributed** to you when your artwork is in our exhibition unless you choose to stay anonymous



Attributed means that the researchers will put your name next to your artwork so that people know you created your artwork



The research team will use your artist statement when they do their research



Your name will not be included when they do the research



This means your information will be private
